Who we are:

Located in beautiful Orange County, NY, Kaplan is a NYS public junior/senior high school serving up to 100 special education students grades 7-12 and, if needed, through age 21. We provide the opportunity for students to earn Regents or Local diplomas along with CDOS (Career Development Occupational Studies Credential) as well as the SACC (Skills/Achievement Commencement Credential).

We service both residential and day students. St. Christopher's Young Women's Leadership Program shares the property with us. Although the residence is female only, the day program is still accepting both male and female students.

What sets us apart from other schools?

The simple answer, therapeutic support and individually targeted instruction. Our academic classes are 8:1:1, 8 students: 1 teacher (content certified and/or special education certified): 1 teacher aide. Our elective courses are 12:1:1.
